

Can ground wires be used in cable trays

Metal cable trays can be used as equipment grounding conductors (EGCs) if they meet NEC requirements and are properly bonded and grounded.

Conditions for Using Cable Trays as Grounding Conductors

Metallic cable trays may serve as the EGC in electrical installations, but only under specific conditions. The tray must be made of conductive metal such as steel or stainless steel, and it must be electrically continuous and mechanically secure throughout the installation. Non-metallic cable trays cannot be used as grounding conductors. The tray must also meet the minimum cross-sectional metal area requirements specified in NEC Table 318-7(b)(2) to safely carry fault currents.

Installation and Bonding Practices

When using a cable tray as a ground path, all sections should be bonded together using grounding clamps or jumpers to ensure electrical continuity. If an insulated EGC is installed within or alongside the tray, it should be bonded to each or alternate tray sections to prevent the conductor from being displaced under fault conditions. In corrosive environments, insulated conductors with tin or zinc-plated connectors are recommended to prevent electrolytic corrosion, especially when using aluminum trays.
