

How to use red light on a twin-tail fiber optic cable

A red light, typically from a Visual Fault Locator (VFL), is used to test continuity, locate breaks, and identify fibers in a twin-tail fiber optic cable.

What a Red Light Does

A Visual Fault Locator (VFL) emits a bright red light (around 650 nm wavelength) that travels through the fiber, making it possible to visually detect faults, breaks, or severe bends in the cable. The light can be seen through the fiber jacket or at the cable ends, allowing technicians to quickly identify problem areas without complex equipment .

Steps to Use a Red Light on Twin-Tail Fiber

- **Prepare the Cable:** Ensure the twin-tail fiber ends are clean and stripped according to standard procedures. Twin-tail cables have two fibers, often color-coded for identification (commonly red and another color, following TIA-598-C standards), .
- **Connect the VFL:** Insert the VFL connector into one end of the fiber. For twin-tail cables, you can test each fiber individually by connecting the VFL to one fiber at a time.
- **Observe the Light:** Look at the other end of the fiber. A continuous red glow indicates proper continuity. Any breaks, bends, or poor splices will cause the light to leak or stop, highlighting the fault location .
- **Identify Fibers:** Use the color coding of the twin-tail fibers to track which fiber is being tested. For example, if one fiber is red and the other is blue, testing the red fi...
