

Maximum height of cable tray



Article Overview

Standard cable tray heights generally range from 25mm to 150mm, with vertical clearance above trays required to be at least 12 inches for safe installation and maintenance.

Standard Tray Heights

Cable tray height, often referred to as side rail height or tray depth, controls the vertical stacking capacity of cables and affects heat dissipation and NEC fill compliance. Typical heights for cable trays range from 25mm (1 inch) to 150mm (6 inches) depending on the cable volume, ventilation requirements, and type of tray used. Ladder trays, perforated trays, and wire mesh trays may have different height options, with ladder trays often designed for heavier loads and larger power cables. Increasing tray depth does not always improve capacity efficiently; sometimes increasing width provides better airflow and easier cable pulling.

NEC Clearance Requirements

According to NEC Article 392, cable trays must maintain a minimum vertical clearance of 12 inches above the tray to allow safe installation and maintenance access. This clearance ensures that personnel can work safely and that cables are not damaged during handling. Cable trays cannot be installed in hoistways or enclosed spaces and must remain accessible for inspection and maintenance.
